





ADC for Iveggies

regon State University Master Gardeners are used to being watched while they work. But at the Plants of the Apes garden at Chimps Inc. near Tumalo, the gardeners' work is closely supervised by a group of chimpanzees.

That is the idea. The garden, which is located just outside the large, outdoor enclosed ape habitat, is part of a unique life enhancement and educational program for the residents. Chimps Inc. is a nonprofit corporation, established in 1995, which provides a refuge for seven abused and rescued chimpanzees.

A three-tiered organic garden is situated next to the chimpanzees confloor habitat at Chimps Inc. near Tumalo. It's positioned in such a way that the chimpanzees can point to the vegetables that they would like to eat.
