### Featured Plant - Dwarf Globe Blue Spruce

Picea pungens 'Globosa'

Height: 1 - 2.5' Spread: 1 - 3'



#### Why Should I Plant Dwarf Globe Blue Spruce in My Garden?

It is an evergreen with strong, pyramid-shaped growth and the most drought-tolerant spruce for Central Oregon. This tree adds brightness to dark parts of the yard and makes an attractive low hedge against an emerald lawn. Blue needles hold their color well throughout the year but are brightest when they first emerge in spring. It attracts birds.

## Increase State Funding for OSU Extension Master Gardeners™

The State Legislature will determine the OSU Extension Service's Public Service Program funding level as part of the overall state budget. There will be lots of competition for available funds and we need to be sure our legislators understand the importance of the Master Gardener program. In 2017-2019 & 2021-2023, Extension funding had a shortfall which caused prolonged, unfilled vacancies in some MG Programs. Central Oregon is fortunate to currently be fully funded but some Oregon counties have not been able to fill positions that directly impact their Master Gardener programs. Some don't have a horticulture agent or program support staff. In some cases Master Gardeners themselves have to plan and conduct new volunteer training and have seen a major decline in the program services. This is not a good situation and we need to help assure adequate funding for all!

The Oregon Master Gardener Association (OMGA) is doing a letter writing campaign to educate our legislators about the importance of Master Gardeners. We need each member of COMGA to write a letter! To make this easy for you, we'll send you some sample emails to choose from or customize, the addresses of your state legislators, and instructions on what to do. The rest is up to you!

Be looking for this email and act quickly. Time is of the essence, as the State budget has many priorities, and we want to make sure that OSU Statewide Public Service Programs are included.

### Master Gardener Advanced Training Opportunities

If you're looking for available opportunities to get in your 10 hours minimum of advanced training/continuing education to remain certified, listed below are some options to consider. The list will be updated monthly.

All on-line modules designated for the new MG training class are available for you to view for credit. Modules released so far are: Soils, Botany Basics, and Pesticide Safety. Modules to be released as February progresses are: Integrated Pest Management, Lawn Care, Diversity Equity and Inclusion, and Native Plants. You need access to Canvas to view these modules. Access may be tricky. See the instructions sent by Rachel Humpert for Amy Jo and Lisa in an email on January 18 which had the subject line "OSU Master Gardener Recertification Requirements for 2023." Call Lisa or Rachel at the Extension office for help. Hours of credit vary.

More than 20 certified Master Gardeners registered for one of the Seed Sowing and Transplanting classes to be taught by Vicky Kemp on February 11 and 16. The class is worth 2 hours of credit. Those classes are full. We'll be filming Vicky's presentation, so it should be available to view later on.

Consider the final Slido Trivia Tournament game on Zoom. There have been 4, each worth an hour of advanced training. The final competition is "Being Fruitful: Orchards and Small Fruit" on February 16 at 6:00 pm. Watch for the reminder email prior to the event with instructions for how join on both Zoom and Slido and/or go to Amy Jo's email dated 10/11/22 with the subject line "Trivia Tournament for Oregon Master Gardeners...." I've done all four held to date and they are informative, fun and very challenging. One tip I have from the past games is that they are heavy on questions based on the scientific Latin names (Ex. Rosaceae, the apple family, or Tortricidae family member Cydia pomonella, the codling moth) not common names. COMGA may do a Slido Trivia game at a general meeting later this year.

### Myrmecochory by Judy Shearer

Have you ever heard the word, Myrmecochory? Well, neither had I until I started researching material for my plant selection this month. And a gem it is, the Oregon endemic, fetid adder's tongue. Not such a glamorous name for the tiny beautiful plant. Scoliopus halii, only 2 -5" tall, has two basal oval leaves with pointed tips. Sometimes the green leaves are mottled with brown spots. The flowers are pale vellow-green with prominent purplish brown lines (see pictures below). The sepals are spreading or recurving, the petals are erect linear, stamens 3, stigmas 3. Now here comes the fetid part. The flowers give off an offensive musky odor which attracts the pollinator, fungus gnats. Once pollinated the stalk starts to twist and bend over putting the capsule containing the developing seeds close to the ground. The fruit is an elliptical capsule, brownish purple in color with the style and stigmas forming a beak. The enclosed seeds are oblong with an elaiosome present. An elaiosome is a lipid and protein-rich structure on the seeds of some plants. It contains a volatile substance highly attractive to ants which triggers an instinct to carry the seed back to their nest hence the term myrmecochory or seed dispersal by ants. The ants consume the nutritious elaiosome and the seed is carried away and discarded in a trash midden. The plant in essence has tricked the ants into planting their seeds for them. Fetid adder's tongue does not occur in the high desert as it prefers moist woodland habitats west of the Cascades. A trip to Cascadia State Park about two hours northwest of Bend sometime in late March/April is a good place to view the plant. Just take the first trail right off the main parking area. Beware though, it is small and easily overlooked if not observant. Look for those leaves.

### LOWDOWN FROM THE BOARD

February 2, 2023 The meeting was held via Zoom.

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 a.m. The board discussed the following:

The minutes of the meeting held January 5, 2022, were approved, upon motion by Tim Schindele and seconded by Marilyn Clark.

**OSU Report:** Amy Jo reported that local MG training is moving along and week 3 is complete. Officially 48 trainees with an additional 2 transfers.

Gail Langellotto will be stepping down as Statewide Master Gardener Coordinator at the end of June. She will be staying on to do teaching and research. This position will be filled but in a different capacity.

The Waterwise Garden booklet will need to be reprinted this year. We do not need more Vegetable Garden guides printed this year. Additionally, Amy Jo needs to do a revision to this before we do a reprint. Firewise revisions are mostly done with a goal of June to have this finished. Cheryl H. reported Vickie Minor would like 4-6 boxes of Vegetable Gardening booklets for the home show.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

**Treasurer's Report:** Marilyn Clark discussed income and expenses for January. There was a donation of \$400 by Patricia Kolling. Vickie K. submitted expenses for the June garden fair preparation.

Marilyn C. and Tim S. cashed out the CD at NW Community Credit Union and used additional funds from the First Interstate checking account to purchase new CD that has an interest rate of 4%.

NW Community Credit Union requires a resolution listing signers on the account. Motion by Marilyn C. to make President, Janet Dart, Secretary, Tammara Waterman, and Treasurer Marilyn Clark as signers on all bank accounts that COMGA has, including but not limited to First Interstate Bank and NW Community Credit Union effective January 1, 2023. After a second by Kris K. the motion was passed.

There was a short discussion about what dollar amount must have two signers on checks. The COMGA policy is that checks over \$500 should have two signers.

**Membership Report:** Deb G. reported 54 dues and membership forms submitted and paid for, with a total of \$285 to add to the membership account. Information from the online skills survey is being compiled and will be distributed. Continued on page 6 Deb G will submit something for the HoeDown asking people to complete the skills form. Additionally, Janet D. will include a reminder in the message from the president.

**MG Advanced Training:** Tim S. submitted a list of training opportunities to the board and a monthly list will be put in the HoeDown. This list is a work in progress with dates and classes to be confirmed.

Pat K. may do another pruning class at HHCG and the Community Garden. Tim will check with Amy Jo to determine if this will qualify for advanced training.

Level up presentations will be included in get togethers. A vegetable growing contest is being organized as part of the picnic, with judges and awards to be given.

**Community Education:** Cher H. reported on the Seed Sowing and Transplanting demonstration class. This class has been very popular with a lot of interest. Both 60 person classes have filled with a waitlist of 114 people. Stuart Taylor offered sound equipment/TV and technical services for classes.

Growing Veggies in CO classes are filling up quickly on Eventbrite. These classes will not overlap with Spring Seminar classes. May have some time in March for additional classes if they can find an instructor.

Met with Tim to discuss what classes can be combined as public facing and MG advanced training.

Rocky reported that there is confirmation on classes and speakers for Spring Seminar. Nancy G. will put the list on the COMGA website. Registration will be available online the first part of March. Janet will send out a request for help with the Spring Seminar classes. Spring Seminar will be the first 4 Saturdays in April. This will be a live webinar and will be recorded for access later. Waiting to hear from Amy Jo what classes will be considered for advanced training. The cost for Spring Seminar will be the same as last year, \$5 per class.

**Historian Report:** Kris K. reported there may be a small budget overage when Mimi T. submits expenses for the last three years historical books. \$320. End of the year books are on the COMGA website. Shutterfly product not as good a quality as they have been in the past. Kris K. will be uploading pictures from the historical book.

Flickr account renewal is not due until next year. Kris K. will edit and delete duplicate photos from Flickr account.

Rebecca Charleton volunteered to manage the COMGA Instagram account. Jan Evan reported the first year the COMGA Instagram account was very active but since that time we have not had anyone to manage it. Jan Evan to get in touch with Rebecca Charleton and provide protocol for posting to Instagram.

COMGA has a variety of social media accounts. We have a Facebook page that is monitored closely. Twitter is used for brief news alert items. Instagram is used for photos and videos. YouTube is used to post videos. We have never used Pinterest but could consider. Jan Even is Team Lead for Marketing and we are looking for Marketing Assistants to help her with press releases and the many social media outlets. We also need to recruit more teaching assistants and instructors.

### **OMGA Representative Report:**

Karen S. reported March 3 is the next meeting. The Joy of Gardening seminar is scheduled for July 7/8 and will have scholarships available.

Needs Assessments survey will be coming. This will provide an awareness of positions available in our program.

Copy Pat K. when letter is sent, so that she can record the number of letters being sent. Timeline from the OMGA taskforce is to have the letters be sent in February. Rocky will send pie charts and form letters to the general COMGA membership with a request for letters to be written. Janet requested this be put in the Member section on the website and suggested this be put in the HoeDown with a link to the website.

**Discovery Park Update:** Janet D. reported Gary Weber is stepping down. He will be sending information on his replacement.

**Hollinshead Update:** Janet D. reported for Kirsten H. HHCG will need 4 new mentors this year. Opening day will be April 16. A Build a Raised Garden Bed community education class is being organized, date to follow.

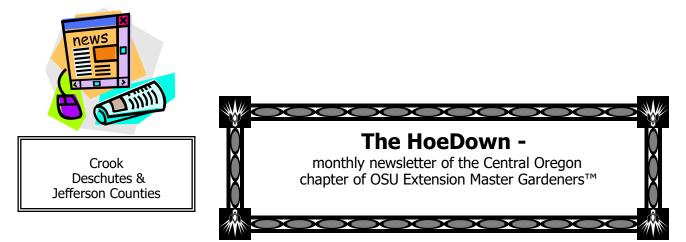
