The first signs of spring are here and that means it's getting close to start sowing seeds for the COMGA Plant Sale that will be June 2, 2018, Saturday. NorthWest Crossing Community Garden By Tina Burnside

OSU Master Gardeners will again have a lottery system for available NWX (North West Crossing) raised garden beds. The garden, located on Discovery Park Drive near the intersection with NW Crossing Drive, has



51 raised beds. We park on the street and walk around the dog-park to the garden.

Interested gardeners will email or call me to enter the lottery. The policy is one garden bed per family. Our team will meet at the garden where we put all the names in a bowl and have a 'blind draw' for the lottery winners,



and then another blind draw to assign the available beds. They are contacted by email with their bed number and their garden assistants.

As a GA, you email information to your gardeners including irrigation schedule updates, weather alerts for frosty nights, dates of our classes at the garden, Master Gardner events including Plant Sale, Garden Tour and other tips and hints.

Opening day, Saturday May 5th at 9:30, is when Master Gardener Assistants (GAs) meet both new and returning gardeners. Each gardener receives their NWX Booklet with helpful hints, contact information and our schedule of seven garden classes at our garden.



After rental fees are paid, which are \$25 for those age 65+ and \$30 age 64 and under, we have a brief 'best practices' discussion. It includes the importance of building a cloche given our temperature and location, plus helpful other hints and tips. We will sell row cover and soil

thermometers.

Saturday, May 19, at 9:30 is 'Getting Started'. We help them build their cloche and discuss the importance of adding compost to their bed. Our total of 7 classes, including Garden with Kids, Pollinators & Pesky Pests, Grow Garlic, Open Garden, and Garden Learning Curve are listed in their booklet. Closing day is Saturday, October 6th.

Action Items:

Audit Report-- Tim Schindele, Shelby Smith, and Nancy Glick developed an Annual Financial Review Procedure to be included in the COMGA Policies and Procedures. We discussed the committee findings and the checklist. We will vote on accepting or changes next month.

HoeDown and Trainees-- Nancy Glick lead a discussion on the trainees getting their first copy of the HoeDown in March as they do now or changing it to January or February. Rocky Bessette will check with Amy Jo Detweiler on timing. Jolene Dodge volunteered to interview 4 trainees once a month for a get to know you for the HoeDown.

Plant Sale-- Vicky Kemp reported about half the spots for work in the greenhouse are filled. She is going to limit volunteers to 1 day per person. The faucet in the greenhouse is being replaced. Vicky has adjusted the quantities of tomatoes with

records of what sold last year.

Growing Gardeners (formerly called Mini College) is being put together now. Speakers are set with a target of 75% of classes qualifying as advanced training. There will be 4 workshops, a bookstore plus vendors and a silent auction.

Open Forum-- Jan Even asked to have someone cover taking pictures on project day for her. She can not be there that day.

Liz Douville showed a 2002 treasurer's report and HoeDown. The treasurers report was fun to see the changes from 2002 to 2018.

10 Minute University: We watched a Ted Talk on composting as a business.

Project Status Reports:

Community Education-- JoAnne Abbott reported everything is on track for 2018 classes.



COMGA March 2018 HoeDown




One of our long time veteran Master Gardeners has taken the 'plunge'! She will soon be moving from Bend to Walla Walla to be closer to her family.
